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# European Universities Initiative

Erasmus+ – Key Action 2 – European Universities

The aim behind this initiative is to bring together a **new generation of creative Europeans**, who are able to cooperate across languages, borders and disciplines to address the big societal challenges and skills shortages that Europe faces.

These transnational alliances will be the European **universities of the future**, promoting European values and identity, and revolutionizing the **quality and competitiveness** of European higher education.

# European Universities Initiative

**Education across Europe is rapidly changing, with deep technological and structural changes affecting teaching and learning.**

Next to their core tasks of teaching and research, universities will increasingly **help address big societal challenges** and become true engines of **development for the cities and regions they are based in**. This requires enhanced cooperation between universities.

Today, there are some attempts to use synergies, but cooperation is sporadic and a lot of potential remains untapped.

With its European Universities initiative, the Commission is trying to foster excellence, innovation and inclusion in higher education across Europe.

# Terms and references

The European University must be composed of a **minimum of three higher education institutions** from at least three EU Member States. (ideally composed of 5 to 8 partners)

Maximum EU contribution awarded for a **3-year** European University is 5 000 000 EUR.

**Maximum of 80%** of total eligible costs in co-financing.

# Key cooperation principles

- Students, doctoral candidates and staff can move seamlessly (physically or virtually) to study, train, teach, do research, work, or share services in any of the partner institutions. **Embedded mobility at all levels**, including at Bachelor, Master and Doctoral levels. **At least 50%** of the students within the alliance should benefit from such mobility, be it physical, virtual or blended.
- Students customise their choice of where and what to study. **New joint and flexible curricula**, integrating innovative pedagogies, including the use of the latest digital technologies. While content is personalised, cooperation is global.
- Practical and/or work-based experience is provided by external mentors to foster an **entrepreneurial mindset** and develop civic engagement.

Closely **interconnecting with regions**, creating a trans-European ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship

Promotion of **innovative methodologies and practical lessons** aimed at the labor market

New and innovative network that builds upon existing **bi-national and tri-national agreements** between the participating universities

Merge the various **mobility agreements**

To contribute to the development of a knowledge-based European economy, with **inclusion of Associate Partners**.

Promote **active European citizenship** within a shared European environment, Include **collaborations with the public and private sector** in the region.

Offer a coordinated program in training and research around the theme of the **Sustainable Urban Development**.

# Good practices: Selected projects 1<sup>st</sup> call

**Redressing inequalities** in university capabilities to attract funding

Respond to societal, economic, technical and environmental challenges of the coastal areas around **4 dimensions**: Environment and Biodiversity, Sustainable Energy and Building, Digital Transformation and Cultures, Companies and education.

Take the best of the tradition of each country's culture and will aim to **integrate popular and academic culture.**
